LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Happy New Year from the ESCCRC!

We hope that you all had a restful break, stayed warm, enjoyed some family and friends time, ate some delicious food, and are prepared for a successful 2025. The ESCCRC is looking forward to continuing our relationship with each of you as we learn, grow, and build relationships that benefit young children.

Exciting news to announce this quarter: The Eastern Shore Child Care Resource Center (ESCCRC) received two new grants that promote the Growing Opportunities for Family Child Care (GOFCC) program. Funding came from local sources: the Perdue Foundation and the Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore. The ESCCRC is so grateful for these generous grants that make state-required and small-business trainings available to in-home early childhood programs.

Over the last three years, the ESCCRC has worked diligently to support new home-based programs throughout our eight-county region with state funding. GOFCC has supported 36 new homebased early childhood programs on the Eastern Shore. With the private funding, the ESCCRC will continue to guide and support new programs with business trainings available to all interested home-based early childhood educators this year. In January, the Business Foundations Series will be offered in four modules on January 7, 14, 21 and 28. This series is a broad overview of how to manage your child care business in your home. Business strategies, marketing, taxes and programming will be covered. Call the main office for information and to sign up. This is such a helpful series that we encourage all home-based providers, no matter how experienced or how long they have been in business, to attend.

Another series that will transform your in-home child care business is All Our Kin. It is an in-depth look at business management specific to operating a child care business in your home and will be offered this spring. All interested homebased early childhood educators are encouraged to register and attend. Be on the lookout for the schedule.

In other training news, Block Parties are scheduled! Wicomico County child care providers will be able to participate in this training opportunity this February and March. There will be three sessions: February 5 (registration begins on January 22), February 19 (registration begins on February 5) and March 5 (registration begins on February 19). NEWS FROM THE INFANT AND TODDLER SCENE

Stress-Free Developmentally Appropriate Learning Experiences for Infants and Toddlers

Developing experiences (lesson plans) for infant and toddlers should not cause additional stress. Educators often over think play experiences for infants and toddlers. Activities should be simple, engaging, developmentally appropriate and include challenges that stimulate the mind. During the first year of life, babies begin to understand how different objects work together and what they can do in relationship to each other. Expensive learning toys are not necessary. Look around your environment for items you already have that will encourage exploration and thinking. How can you expand on songs or books that your children really enjoy? Running bus wheels through bright colored paint and then making bus tracks on plain paper would expand "The Wheels on the Bus" song. How often do you find yourself wanting to make handprint or footprint crafts to send home? Why not pair this activity with a great book, *Ten Little Fingers and Ten Little Toes*, by Mem Fox, illustrated by Helen Oxenbury (2008) and create a developmentally appropriate learning experience?

Could you play hide and seek with simple everyday items they already enjoy? Do you have items you could use for color matching and sorting? What are some items in your program that children can stack, roll, bounce, dump or fill? Many activities can be made from recycled materials. Think about simple items like boxes, plastic bowls and cups, bins and pocketbooks, scarfs, and wooden spoons. Children are naturally curious and will engage with a multitude of materials if they are made available to them. Always keep safety and the developmentally appropriateness of materials in mind. Small object choke testing tubes are readily available online and can be used to test the safety of materials before using.

Zero to Three encourages educators to include activities that are action oriented, include quite play time, build thinking skills, enhance the senses and develop language. If you believe a particular child care program is in violation of state child care licensing laws or regulations, you may file an official complaint against that program. To file a complaint, contact the Regional Licensing Office covering the county where the program is located.

Thank you for abiding by the following training policy. By doing this, you are helping us maintain our high standards and provide the highest quality training:

- You must pre-register for all classes. Registration forms can be found on ESCCRC's website, in our newsletter or at our office. Training registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis; register early. You are not considered to be registered for a class until payment has been received.
- Payment for a class should be made payable to Salisbury University. We gladly accept cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. There is a \$25 returned check fee. You can now register online with your Visa or MasterCard at
- www.training.easternshoreccrc.org
- Class registration fees are non-refundable. However, if you are unable to attend a training session, you must notify our office by close of business the day before the training or the full price of the training will be charged to your account.
- In order to ensure that all classes are conducted as scheduled, please register early. If the minimum registration requirement is not met prior to the class, it will be canceled. We will notify all registered students of this cancelation.
- In order to get a certificate for training, an attendee will need to be present for the entire training. Complete an assessment and evaluation and turn it in — This allows the ESCCRC to maintain funding as your CCRC and training hub. ATTENTION: In order to provide your certificate in a reasonable amount of time, you must submit your Assessment and Evaluation. No certificate will be sent if a completed assessment and evaluation is received after one month from trainina date.
- Please be on time for all trainings, as no one will be admitted late. Leaving a training early or arriving late can distract others from learning. Also, taking only a portion of a training does not allow for a participant to get a full grasp of the subject and takes away training opportunities from other providers who need the full amount of training hours.
- · Although we love children at ESCCRC, please do not bring them to class with you.

• Certificates will be awarded to all participants successfully completing all requirements of a class. Please keep these certificates for licensing and credentialing purposes.

This is your professional responsibility!

- Please check with local television stations for any possible cancelations due to bad weather. If a training is canceled, it will be rescheduled for a later date. The Resource Center is closed if Salisbury University is closed.
- Please be respectful of the trainer and other class members. Save private conversations for break time or after class. Cell phones, including texting, can be disruptive to others. Please turn your cell phone off at the beginning of class or put it on silent. Disruptive participants will be asked to leave the class and will not be given credit for the class or a refund.
