LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Hello Everyone,

Here we are again, another spring. Another chance to spend the next few months enjoying the beautiful weather characteristic of the Eastern Shore! Another opportunity to take that curriculum outdoors and take in the wonder of springtime's sights and smells. We plan to offer workshops on maximizing your outside play time.

Outside play is so necessary for young children. Besides the active movement, creative interpretation, interaction with nature and good old vitamin D, outdoor play maximizes children's mental health. Physical activity also boosts positive feelings, which increases endorphins and fosters higher self-esteem.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), during the pandemic there has been a 25% increase in depression and anxiety worldwide including young children. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), over a similar period, also reported that mental health-related emergency department visits increased 24% for elementary-aged children. The American Psychological Association (APA) considers this a children's mental health crisis. It has been a difficult few years for everyone.

A first step solution is to get outside. Physiological changes take place when interacting outdoors that lower blood pressure and heart rate, reduce stress, improve sleep quality, increase creativity, and better learning and relationshipbuilding. Giving children a chance to run and play outdoors enhances emotional well-being.

If you believe more help is needed, the next step in your program is to contact the Eastern Shore Child Care Resource Center (ESCCRC). We can observe your classroom and make suggestions that may improve your mental health environment. If the situation is more than environmental, we can put you in touch with the Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Program (IECMH) based in the Wye Mills and Salisbury areas. Assistance from the ESCCRC and the IECMH programs are a part of the coaching services offered to center and home-based programs.

There are some exciting things happening at ESCCRC. Keep an eye out



for the emails you receive about twice a month. If you do not receive emails from us, it may be that we have an incorrect address or no address at all. Call us at 410-543-6650 to let us know – better yet, become a member of the ESCCRC. It meets the requirements for one (1) PAU.

Since the last *Child Care Chat*, new staff have joined the ESCCRC. We have a new office administrative assistant. Her name is Jenn Hogan, and you may know her from the child care field. She has six years' experience working with children, managing the office, CCS and family interactions. Jen has an associate degree and is working on her bachelor's in early childhood education as she tries to keep us organized!

Andrea Clymire joined the ESCCRC in January as an early childhood and infant/ toddler coach. She works out of the Wye Mills office and serves Caroline and Dorchester counties while also training in person and virtually. Andrea also comes from the child care community, most recently from Worcester County. She has a master's degree and handles our social media presence.

As the coordinator of our Growing Opportunities for Family Child Care (GOFCC) program, Carolyn Frisby joined us in mid-December. 
Thank you for abiding by the following training policy. By doing this, you are helping us maintain our high standards and provide the highest quality training:

- You must pre-register for all classes. Registration forms can be found on ESCCRC's website, in our newsletter or at our office. Training registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis; register early. You are not considered to be registered for a class until payment has been received.
- Payment for a class should be made payable to Salisbury University. We gladly accept cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. There is a \$25 returned check fee. You can now register online with your Visa or MasterCard at www.training.easternshoreccrc.org
- Class registration fees are non-refundable. However, if you are unable to attend a training session, you must notify our office by close of business the day before the training or the full price of the training will be charged to your account.
- In order to ensure that all classes are conducted as scheduled, please register early. If the minimum registration requirement is not met prior to the class, it will be canceled. We will notify all registered students of this cancelation.
- In order to get a certificate for training, an attendee will need to be present for the entire training. Complete an assessment and evaluation and turn it in — This allows the ESCCRC to maintain funding as your CCRC and training hub.
 ATTENTION: In order to provide your certificate in a reasonable amount of time, you must submit your Assessment and Evaluation. No certificate will be sent if a completed assessment and evaluation is received after one month from training date.
- Please be on time for all trainings, as no one will be admitted late. Leaving a training early or arriving late can distract others from learning. Also, taking only a portion of a training does not allow for a participant to get a full grasp of the subject and takes away training opportunities from other providers who need the full amount of training hours.
- Although we love children at ESCCRC, please do not bring them to class with you.

- Certificates will be awarded to all participants successfully completing all requirements of a class. Please keep these certificates for licensing and credentialing purposes. **This is your professional responsibility!**
- Please check with local television stations for any possible cancelations due to bad weather. If a training is canceled, it will be rescheduled for a later date. The Resource Center is closed if Salisbury University is closed.
- Please be respectful of the trainer and other class members. Save private conversations for break time or after class. Cell phones, including texting, can be disruptive to others. Please turn your cell phone off at the beginning of class or put it on silent. Disruptive participants will be asked to leave the class and will not be given credit for the class or a refund.

TASTES AND TEXTURES AND YOUR INFANT & TODDLER

From the Infant & Toddler Scene

Giving your child foods with a variety of different tastes and textures can help them:

- Develop fine motor skills (like pinching and picking food up with her fingers).
- Develop chewing skills.
- Learn to accept and like a variety of foods.
- You can let your child try a variety of textures, including:
- Smooth (strained or pureed).
- Mashed or lumpy.
- Finely chopped or ground.

Your child may start out with smooth or mashed foods first and then begin to eat finely chopped or ground foods as he or she gets older. Encourage your child to pinch or pick up food as they develop these skills. By nine months, most babies can pick up foods like small, cut-up pieces of fruit.
