LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Hello Everyone,

Happy summer! Of course, you have creative ways to maximize your outside time during the summer months! Water play of all sorts cools the kids: water tables, sprinklers, misters, slip 'n' slides and pools. Planned outdoor snack time using watermelons, oranges, fruit pops and a cooler full of water keeps children hydrated. You could also make some ice cream. Setting up a cool, breezy outdoor activity area can be fun. Take the books out on a picnic blanket, set up easels under a canopy for shade, and take advantage of a great sprawling tree with acres of shade for manipulatives and puzzles, a game table, or a drawing spot. Summertime is full of opportunities to be creative and take your curriculum outdoors.

While summer outside play is fun and memorable (think about your summers outside with friends), here are some safety tips adapted from Seattle Children's Hospital (seattlechildrens.org) so everyone can stay safe while having a good time in the sun:

- Protect children from too much sun. The sun's rays are strongest between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., so be extra careful during that time.
- Use sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15. Choose one that protects against UVA and UVB rays.
- Apply sunscreen 30 minutes before going outside. Reapply every two hours and after being in the water or sweating.
- Keep children under 1 out of the sun as much as you can. Dress babies in lightweight, light-colored clothing with long sleeves and long pants. Always cover their head.
 Children under 6 months of age can have small amounts of sunscreen put on their faces and the backs of their hands, but be careful not to get it in their eyes or mouth.
- Most of the sun's burning rays go right through clouds, so use sunscreen even on cloudy days.

- Make sure your children drink plenty of fluids even if they are not thirsty. Water is best.
- Take breaks to cool off in the shade.
- Consider humidity along with temperature when going outside to play.
- Never leave children alone in or near the water, even for a minute. Actively watch children when they are in and around water. Be super vigilant.
- Even buckets and wading pools are drowning hazards for very young children.



Don't forget to check the air quality so children can breathe freely. There's an app for that! Download Clean Air Partners and check daily air quality forecasts, current air quality information and alerts when the air is unhealthy to breathe.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) offers a flyer called *Action Steps* for Sun Protection that you can download and share with families and staff. The website is www.EPA.gov. Remember that Supervision = Safety and Outdoor Play = Outdoor Curriculum. Stay alert and, above all. have fun in the sun!

Thank you for abiding by the following training policy. By doing this, you are helping us maintain our high standards and provide the highest quality training:

- You must pre-register for all classes. Registration forms can be found on ESCCRC's website, in our newsletter or at our office. Training registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis; register early. You are not considered to be registered for a class until payment has been received.
- Payment for a class should be made payable to Salisbury University. We gladly accept cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. There is a \$25 returned check fee. You can now register online with your Visa or MasterCard at www.training.easternshoreccrc.org
- Class registration fees are non-refundable. However, if you are unable to attend a training session, you must notify our office by close of business the day before the training or the full price of the training will be charged to your account.
- In order to ensure that all classes are conducted as scheduled, please register early. If the minimum registration requirement is not met prior to the class, it will be canceled. We will notify all registered students of this cancelation.
- In order to get a certificate for training, an attendee will
 need to be present for the entire training. Complete an
 assessment and evaluation and turn it in This allows the
 ESCCRC to maintain funding as your CCRC and training hub.
 ATTENTION: In order to provide your certificate in
 a reasonable amount of time, you must submit your
 Assessment and Evaluation. No certificate will be sent
 if a completed assessment and evaluation is received after
 one month from training date.
- Please be on time for all trainings, as no one will be admitted late. Leaving a training early or arriving late can distract others from learning. Also, taking only a portion of a training does not allow for a participant to get a full grasp of the subject and takes away training opportunities from other providers who need the full amount of training hours.
- Although we love children at ESCCRC, please do not bring them to class with you.

- Certificates will be awarded to all participants successfully completing all requirements of a class. Please keep these certificates for licensing and credentialing purposes.
 This is your professional responsibility!
- Please check with local television stations for any possible cancelations due to bad weather. If a training is canceled, it will be rescheduled for a later date. The Resource Center is closed if Salisbury University is closed.
- Please be respectful of the trainer and other class members.

RED FLAGS IN INFANT DEVELOPMENT

From the Infant & Toddler Scene

- Cannot bend arms or legs
- Does not smile, move or look at you when you talk or play with them
- Does not want to be held
- Does not make sounds by age 3 months
- Does not babble by age 6 months
- Shows no affection for caregivers
- Seems very floppy, like a rag doll
- Doesn't respond to sounds around them

Sharing information and effectively communicating with families can assist them in requesting a more formal developmental screening with a health care provider or other agency like the Maryland Infants & Toddlers Program.
