Early Childhood Mental Health Legislation Arrives to the Governor's Desk!

House Bill 513, "Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Support Services Program," was passed in the Maryland House of Delegates by a 137-1 vote AND passed in the Senate with a 47-0 vote!

This legislation establishes an early childhood program that promotes effective, positive health practices through referrals and services for children, families, educators, and caregivers.

The bill additionally increases funding for the operation of the Program by \$1 million to address the need for consultation services.

Passing the bill provides security and stability to the Support Services Program.

Governor Hogan will now decide if this bill becomes law!



April is the Month of the Young Child Topic: Redirection

Redirection can be defined as a way to change your child's behavior from "inappropriate to appropriate." It is a useful and impactful tool because it allows the parent or teacher to give consequences, set expectations, and offer a positive behavior in place of the undesirable behavior.

Redirection creates teachable moments and helps support children's positive behaviors and decision-making in a healthy way.

Consistency is key! Redirection is a learning process and is more effective long term than simply saying 'no' or 'stop.' Making sure this tool is used consistently will generate the most effective results.

Redirection in action:

Look at your child. Remain physically close. Use a stern facial expression. Make a brief, limit-setting statement. For example, "First, you do ____, then you may


Keep your voice at a low volume and low intensity.

Use effective praising and redirect your child to another positive behavior.
