LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

We have said goodbye to 2017. As we welcome the New Year, I thank you for your dedication to caring for early learners every day. You are the special people who give children opportunities to become successful school-agers, productive adults and nurturing parents. You impact children in all developmental areas.

Every day there is something new and different going on in the lives of young children. Adults expect them to remember things and grow from their experiences. Parents want to see progress. Teachers constantly quiz children or set up challenges to keep them on their toes, ever ready to answer a question or perform a task. Assessments (formal and informal) are a large part of early education. Think about the pressure that puts on children when their main desire is to please the adults around them.

They are not thinking about checking off a developmental skill. They want to see the smile on a parent's face. They want a "thumbs up" gesture from a pleased teacher. They want new things to play with, self-set "problems" to solve, new ideas to implement and discoveries to make while interacting with peers. They are motivated and encouraged by your support.

As you set up your early childhood environment, think about how you will motivate children not only to learn and be academically ready for kindergarten, but also to interact

with other children and grown-ups. Children learn early on to communicate needs depending on the response they get from adults. Young children respond to the expectations of their teachers according to the reaction/response they receive from the teacher.

Think about your interactions with young children. What are your expectations? What tone do you set? Are your behaviors a good model for children? Children watch and imitate as you demonstrate the way to interact with others. Well-developed social skills allow a child to establish positive and rewarding relationships with others.

Relationships are essential to success in school – and life. Learning the give and take of successful communication, getting along with others, understanding social cues, and learning about rules of etiquette that keep the community humming along pleasantly are important to future achievement. Child care providers of all types are role models. Children observe how you interact with others. They listen to your words and expressions, watch your behaviors, and follow your lead.



They copy phrases and use them. They also mimic the way you work with others, conduct yourself in a conversation, and conform to the rules of school and society.

TRAINING POLICY

Thank you for abiding by the following training policy. By doing this, you are helping us maintain our high standards and provide the highest quality training:

- You must preregister for all classes. Registration forms can be found on LSCCRC's website, in our newsletter or at our office. Training registrations are on a first-come, first-served basis; register early. **You are not considered to be registered for a class until payment has been received in our office.**
- Payment for a class should be made payable to Salisbury University. We gladly accept cash, check, Visa or MasterCard. There is a \$25 returned check fee.
- Class registration fees are nonrefundable. **However, if you are unable to attend a training session, you must notify our office by close of business the day before the training in order to receive credit towards another class.**

- In order to ensure that all classes are conducted as scheduled, please register early. If the minimum registration requirement is not met prior to the class, it will be cancelled. We will notify all registered students of this cancellation.
- In order to get a certificate for training, an attendee will need to be present for the entire training.
- Please be on time for all trainings, as no one will be admitted late. Leaving a training early or arriving late can distract others from learning. Also, taking only a portion of a training does not allow for a participant to get a full grasp of the subject and takes away training opportunities from other providers who need the full amount of training hours.
- Although we love children at LSCCRC, please do not bring them to class with you.

- Certificates will be awarded to all participants successfully completing a class. Please keep these certificates for licensing and credentialing purposes. If you need a duplicate copy of your certificate, you will be charged \$1 per copy.
- Please check with local television stations for any possible cancellations due to bad weather. If a training is cancelled, it will be rescheduled for a later date.
- Please be respectful of the trainer and other class members. Save private conversations for break time or after class. Cell phones, including texting, can be disruptive to others. Please turn your cell phone off at the beginning of class or put it on silent. Disruptive participants will be asked to leave the class and will not be given credit for the class or a refund.

STEM OPPORTUNITY

The Lower Shore Child Care Resource Center received a grant from the Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore to present training called *The STEM Project: Using Science in the Preschool Setting*. This is a three-session training to increase awareness of and comfort including Science and STEM activities in your daily schedule. There are several requirements of the grant outlined below that will help you to know if you or a staff member qualifies to take part.

- Are you a teacher or assistant in a preschool classroom?
- Can you commit to attending all three sessions?
- Do you promise to include science exploration in your daily activities?
- Will you participate in a survey and ongoing follow-up and TA?

If you answered “yes” to these questions, **The STEM Project** training is for you! Only one teacher from each center may attend. The cohort will be evenly dispersed throughout the tri-county area. You **MUST** commit to all three Thursdays: February 15, March 8 and April 12; 6-9 p.m. at the LSCCRC. No substitutions will be allowed.



You will receive 9 hours of COK training in Curriculum. The training is free and each participant will receive science materials to use in their classroom. The workshops will be taught by Jeni Davis, Ph.D., assistant professor in the Teacher Education Department at Salisbury University. INFANT AND TODDLER MINUTE – MORE THAN BABY TALK

Talking with infants and toddlers is so much more than "baby talk." Early language and communication skills are crucial for children's success in school and beyond. The chart below describes 10 practices that early childhood educators can use to support the development of language and communication skills of infants and toddlers. Because research supports the importance of adult-child interactions for infants and toddlers, the practices are designed to be done one-on-one or

in small groups. Incorporate these practices into your everyday work with young children!



PRACTICE	DESCRIPTION
1. Get Chatty	Engaging in conversations with children
2. Be a Commentator	Giving descriptions of objects, activities or events
3. Mix It Up	Using different types of words and grammar
4. Label It	Providing children with names of objects or actions
5. Tune In	Engaging in activities or objects that interest children
6. Read Interactively	Using books to engage children's participation
7. Read it Again and Again!	Reading books multiple times
8. Props, Please!	Introducing objects that spark conversations
9. Make Music	Engaging in musical activities
10. Sign It	Using gestures or simple signs with words
